



AERIAL TREE RIGGING

The course covers the use of rigging for the removal of small tree sections in relation to pruning operations where targets below may pose a significant risk through to the removal of part/whole trees where targets do not allow for free-fall/hand thrown techniques. All current legislation and codes of practice will be covered. This course is for operators with significant experience of arboriculture operations and chainsaw operations in a canopy.

THE COURSE COVERS

- Introduction and identification of alternative lowering/rigging equipment
- Branch and stem timber removal from the crown
- Planning of operations Review of chainsaw handling and starting techniques in the tree
- Safe removal of lowered timber/branches that have got caught up in the crown
- Setting lowering and pulling lines in the crown in conjunction with the ground crew
- Use of climbing equipment and tree access aids
- Use of various false crotches, pulleys and friction lowering devices
